CARE PLANNING

In partnership with Community Care for Central Hastings, our Care Planner is the first point of contact for new client assessments and continued client follow up and reassessment.

Our Care Planner will make a home visit to talk with you regarding your needs and share information about available SFCSC programs and services that may be helpful.

Your assessment may contain information on your:

- mental and physical health
- personal and health history
- finances
- contact information



The information collected during your assessment is confidential by law, and is only used by authorized staff. Unless you instruct us otherwise, it may be shared with other health service providers who can better serve your needs and provide support services to you now and in the future.

FOOD SECURITY & SERVICES

Community Food Bank

All residents from South Frontenac Township and rural Kingston (north of Hwy. 401) who are struggling with food security for themselves and their family are able to receive 7 days worth of non-perishable and fresh food items once a month. The quantity of food provided is based on the family size and availability of in-stock Food Bank items. Hygiene items, diapers and pet food are also provided when available. Registration can be by phone or e-mail, and Food Bank orders are booked by appointment.

Grace Garden & Greenhouse

In partnership with the Loughborough Public School Challenge Program, our garden and greenhouse provide a wonderful learning environment for students. The produce grown is essential to our food security programs providing a variety of fresh vegetables and herbs for Meals on Wheels and our Food Bank Hampers. Garden volunteers always needed, May thru October.

Meals on Wheels - frozen

Seniors and adults with physical disabilities can choose from a number of \$6 main course meals that provide 40% of the recommended daily nutrition for inactive adults. Meals can be picked up at the Grace Centre or with a minimum order of 10 meals, they can be delivered for free.

Meals on Wheels - hot

Seniors and adults with physical disabilities can receive a nutritious hot meal delivered to their door over the noon-hour every Monday, Wednesday and/or Friday for \$8/meal. Meals include soup/salad, entrée and dessert. Dietary restrictions and/or allergies may be accommodated.

SENIORS & COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES

Adult Day

Personal Support Workers and Recreation staff deliver a full day of programming in a group setting for adults living with a cognitive or physical disability. Clients enjoy physical, cognitive, creative and social activities to assist in achieving and/or maintaining their maximum level of functioning.

This program benefits persons living with dementia, Parkinson's, acquired brain injuries, strokes and/or physical impairments, as well as the frail or isolated elderly. It also benefits caregivers by providing respite and support.

Referrals

Family Services

Families and individuals struggling with finances, homelessness and other issues can access support through referrals from our organization. We can provide help with applications for birth certificates and other I.D., as well as programs to assist with utility bills, medical & dental needs and more. Our volunteer-led income tax service helps qualified individuals keep their finances up to date, and maintain access to government programs.

We provide information and resources that help address the root causes of food insecurity, and connect people with the programs and organizations that lead individuals and families toward better health and quality of life.

Foot Care

Trained providers offer basic foot care for older adults (60+) and adults with physical disabilities. The service includes toe nail trimming and filing, callous assessment and reduction, and foot health monitoring. Diabetic referrals are accepted.

Appointments are required. Please soak your feet for 10-15 minutes before coming to your appointment.

FEE: \$25. Avoid an additional charge by providing 24-hours notice for cancellations.

In-home Respite

Health-trained professionals can fill in for family and friends when a break from care-giving is needed.

FEE: \$18 per hour billed at month's end. Subsidies are available for those who qualify.

In-home Services & Home Maintenance

Seniors (60+) and adults with physical disabilities can arrange regular cleanings or assistance with other tasks around the home, such as light housekeeping, minor repairs and cooking. Home Helpers are thoroughly screened and interviewed by staff before being matched with clients.

FEE: \$20 per hour billed at month's end.

Transportation Services

Affordable and reliable transportation for seniors (60+) and adults with physical disabilities living in South Frontenac and rural Kingston. Clients can get assistance getting to and from medical appointments, grocery shopping, social outings and more.

FEE: \$0.45 per kilometer or a \$4.50 flat rate for trips under 10 kilometers. Subsidies are available for those who qualify.

HOSPICE & BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT

Bereavement Services & Support Groups

Trained volunteers and regular Support Groups provide emotional and psychosocial support to individuals and families who are anticipating a death or experiencing grief due to the loss of a loved one.


Visiting Hospice Services

Trained volunteers offer emotional and practical support to clients who have been diagnosed with a terminal or life-limiting illness and live in North, Central or South Frontenac, or the Addington Highlands. The program provides respite for caregivers and the time to do what needs to be done at home or elsewhere while having peace of mind knowing that their loved one is being cared for.

Caregiver Support

Ongoing one-on-one support for caregivers, as well as monthly group support meetings where people can share their thoughts in a safe, confidential environment. We recognize that 'breaks' from care giving are essential and we are here to help.

Diners Club

Friends gather once a month for a delicious full-course meal and entertainment! Take part on Thursdays at noon amongst locations in Glenburnie, Verona, Sydenham and Harrowsmith from September – June. Cost is \$10 at the door.

Grace Social Activity Centre

The Grace Social Activity Centre offers older adults (aged 55+) in South Frontenac and rural Kingston (north of Hwy. 401) a range of programs to support an active lifestyle. Most activities run weekly or monthly in the mornings with some special events taking place in the afternoon. Fitness classes, interesting and educational workshops, cards and games, crafting, book club and writing club – these are just a few of the activities available. Plus, every Tuesday morning you can come to Grace Café, a great opportunity to get together with old friends and meet new ones!

Grace Activity Pass

An annual Grace Activity Pass is available for adults aged 55+ and gives free access to most social and recreation programs, except those that occasionally have an additional cost or admission charges, such as bus tours or special workshops. A Grace Activity Pass costs \$40 and you can purchase one in January every year.



IT WAS MY LOVED ONE AND HERE'S MY STORY:

Dear Donor,

I know that your past donation helped my family, so to show my appreciation, I became a supporter myself. I'm writing to share how your gift to Southern Frontenac Community Services (SFCSC) helped my family. I invite you to consider giving again.

My parents moved to South Frontenac to be closer to their grandchildren. They were vibrant and active early retirees, so it was no surprise that they chose to volunteer at SFCSC. Not only did they take pride in supporting the meal programs, learning new skills and trading recipes, they became dear friends with others they met beyond the walls of the Grace Centre. They had no idea these new friends would become "lifelines" during unfathomable challenges in the years ahead.

Staff at the Grace Centre started noticing changes in my father's health and their concerns were gently shared with me and my mother. My father took so much pride in being helpful. It gave him a sense of purpose and the courage to fight through the changes/challenges he was experiencing. The staff were patient, compassionate and kind, beyond my expectations, and my dad casually made the transition from volunteer to client. As his health deteriorated, he gave up his volunteer role. Soon after, he reached a stage where it wasn't safe for him to remain alone, even for short periods of time. My mother had high expectations of herself and felt it was her role to "do it all". As their daughter, I struggled to juggle my different roles of supporting their needs, caring for my young family and meeting work obligations.

A gift certificate for services encouraged my mom to try some services at home. That was a gift of time--time for herself and the break she didn't know she needed. Meals on Wheels, Home Help, Caregiver Support from SFCSC provided comfort and support during a VERY difficult time. My mind also eased, a little, knowing that SFCSC was there for them.

In the final months of my father's life, the Grace Centre provided caregiver support, palliative volunteer care and respite. The new friends and fellow volunteers now came by the house to bring meals, comfort, love and support. After my father died, my mother, having never been alone for 55 years, learned what it was like to feel "empty" and "lost." However, she was not alone. The bereavement support, a butterfly release ceremony, and a Blue Christmas event helped her journey through that first year. When she was ready, the people at the Grace Social and Activity Centre welcomed her and provided a safe, inviting and caring environment where mom could figure out how to be her "own person". She still joins her fellow retired volunteers at the Good Graces Café and monthly Diners Club luncheons.

I cannot imagine my parents' life in South Frontenac without the services of SFCSC. With their support, my mother, her friends and the many other community seniors will be able to age with grace in their own homes. As one very grateful daughter, I ask that you consider the supports and services you would like to have available to your parents, someone you love or even for yourself. Where else can a person continue to live and thrive in a rural setting with dignity, compassion and friendship for such nominal fees?



Canadian census data projects that by 2036 the number of people living in South Frontenac aged 55-74

will increase by 21% and the 75+ age group will grow by 111%.

Rural living has many benefits. The peace and quiet, fresh air, open spaces, and the sense of a compassionate community with neighbours that you can count on. The rewards are numerous, but country living can also mean greater distances between you and your family's access to help and health support resources.

Southern Frontenac Community Services Corporation (SFCSC) has been helping people in this community for over thirty years.

Our purpose is simple. **We help people.**

Working locally from the historic Grace Centre site, we offer vital health and wellness services that are close to your home.

Services such as supports for the frail elderly, Meals on Wheels deliveries to seniors and people with physical challenges, transportation to medical appointments, and Adult Day program, a Community Food Bank for anyone needing help, and friendly wellness check-in calls to isolated seniors, to name a few. The kind of services that help people stay connected and to live healthier lives. Many seniors are able to maintain their independence and stay in their homes longer.

We never say no to an older adult, a disadvantaged family or an individual in need. Every plan we formulate and every penny we spend is for and about our clients.

Hunger and putting food on the table are daily struggles for some. Our Food Bank and Meals on Wheels programs have always been in demand and well used.

Adding to food insecurity challenges is the tremendous impact of the Covid-19 pandemic that has resulted in significantly more seniors and families reaching out to us for help.

We must expand to serve our future community needs

SFCSC has outgrown its current facility. The condition of the existing site poses significant safety and accessibility issues for our clients who are predominately older adults, as well as for staff and volunteers.

Currently, SFCSC has only one (1) fully accessible entrance with a ramp and automatic door. The second entrance does not meet Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) standards. The parking lot needs to be levelled and paved to become accessible.

The building has a lift that is not AODA compliant and needs to be replaced with an elevator, and public space areas within the building do not have accessible doors.

Due to a lack of space, the SFCSC Food Bank is located in a temporary portable on the site.

KFL&A Public Health reports that safe food handling in the Food Bank barely meets Public Health standards. Food storage and food preparation for the Food Bank requires hand-washing and food-washing sorting areas, which do not exist in the portable.

An expanded facility provides additional space for the Food Bank for food preparation and storage that will better position SFCSC to meet community needs and KFL&A Public Health standards.

SFCSC operates a commercial kitchen in the Grace Centre to support several food programs (Meals on Wheels, Adult Day program meals, etc.). Current policy requires that all perishable and food separation take place in the commercial kitchen which presents difficulties accommodating multiple programs that run simultaneously.

Public Health has advised that SFCSC is currently operating at and beyond the allowable standards for water use. SFCSC currently has three (3) washrooms that do not meet the needs for staff, the multitude of volunteers, clients and active participants.

The septic system currently in use at SFCSC is at capacity in its daily use and the site requires a new, enlarged system that will meet Township of South Frontenac standards.

Due to the absence of soundproofing between the upper and lower levels of the Grace Centre, our Adult Day clients, who are frail seniors, are continuously interrupted and disturbed by our fitness and active living programs for older adults that take place directly above them.

Our Solution is to Expand & Enhance Our Building

We envision an expansion of the Grace Centre that will provide the space needed to deliver our programs and services, and will eliminate the portables. This ambitious construction project will add 2,400 sq. ft. to the Grace Centre and position us to deliver sustainable community support services for years to come.

Results:

- Increase the capacity of SFCSC to address and meet the growing needs of the more than 8,000 seniors residing within our catchment area (rural Kingston and South Frontenac).
- Enhanced efficiencies of food handling and preparation prepare, pack and distribute food hampers in one area.
- Accessible washrooms for volunteers, staff, clients and visitors.
- Safe parking and building access.
- Food Bank expansion complies with Public Health guidelines during Covid-19 or future directives.
- Upgraded space will meet all legislated accessibility regulations and provide user-friendly work areas.
- Hand and food washing stations.
- Professional work areas for staff and volunteers.
- Confidential and physically distanced meeting room.





THE BUSINESS OF HEALTHCARE

The right care in the right place at the right time. SFCSC does this.

Currently the system of administering healthcare is moving from a regional Local Health Integration Network or LHIN, to a model that targets smaller geographical areas called Ontario Health Teams or OHTs. This new system brings together health care providers and health service support organizations to work as one coordinated team to improve patient/client outcomes, lessen the burden on hospitals and provide care close to home. SFCSC is fully involved in the Frontenac Lennox & Addington Ontario Health Team leadership.

"Ontario Health Teams are being introduced to provide a new way of organizing and delivering care that is more connected to patients in their local communities. Under Ontario Health Teams, health care providers (including hospitals, doctors and home and community care providers) work as one coordinated team - no matter where they provide care."

To meet the diverse needs of an aging population and growing numbers of people with chronic and increasingly complex conditions, the government is modifying its focus and some funding models will move from acute care to home and community care.

This paradigm shift in healthcare delivery further secures SFCSC as an important and long-term community resource for the Township of South Frontenac and gives confidence of appropriate operational funding in the years to come.

South Frontenac Township resident, Dr. Duncan Sinclair, C.M., penned a policy paper, Ageing Well.

He identifies "what seniors want, that transformational changes are needed to support the elderly, that living arrangements need to be supported by day programs in the community or services provided in the home."
